

SUMMARY

The doctoral dissertation with the title "Protection of an individual farm in restructuring proceedings" was written under the scientific supervision of dr hab. Teresa Kurowska and dr Paweł Gała.

The dissertation consists of eight chapters, i.e. introductory issues, where issues related to the satisfaction of the debt by way of settlement are briefly discussed, then in the course of restructuring proceedings and by way of enforcement proceedings, i.e. universal enforcement (regulated by bankruptcy law) and singular enforcement (court enforcement proceedings and administrative enforcement proceedings). The second chapter of the dissertation discusses issues related to the framing of the definition of a farm, while the third chapter deals with the issue related to the applicability of the provisions of the Act in place and time. Further, the fourth chapter of the dissertation discusses the subjective issues, i.e. the farmer. The next chapters (fifth and sixth) are devoted, respectively, to the fourth one, restructuring with the use of state aid resources, and the fifth one talks about restructuring with mechanisms other than state aid. The seventh chapter discusses legislation in France, the United States, Switzerland and Ukraine. The dissertation closes with the eighth chapter, that is the conclusion.

Four basic research methods have been adopted in this work, i.e.: the dogmatic-legal method, the method of analysis of European and Polish case law, the historical-legal method and the comparative legal method.

Polish legislation, despite an extensive system of agricultural law, has not introduced effective protection of the individual farm in the process of restructuring.
